Report on Shramdan Activity at Police Station Area, Pethvadgaon

Introduction:

On **1st October 2023**, the **National Service Scheme (NSS)** unit of **Shri Vijaysinha Yadav College, Pethvadgaon**, conducted a **Shramdan** (cleanliness drive) at the **Police Station Area** in Pethvadgaon. The event was held in the morning session and aimed at cleaning the area surrounding the local police station, which is an important public space in the community. The activity was part of the NSS's ongoing commitment to community service, environmental conservation, and promoting a cleaner, safer environment for all.

Activities Conducted:

1. **Waste Collection and Disposal:** The primary focus of the activity was to collect and dispose of waste scattered around the **Police Station Area**. Students collected a significant amount of **plastic waste, dry leaves, and small stones**. By gathering these materials, the students contributed to creating a cleaner, more aesthetically pleasing environment for the police personnel and visitors to the area.
2. **Waste Segregation:** The students practiced **waste segregation**, separating **biodegradable** materials (dry leaves) from **non-biodegradable** materials (plastic waste and small stones). This practice not only ensured proper disposal but also emphasized the importance of waste management, which is vital in reducing environmental pollution and promoting recycling efforts.
3. **Cleaning of Surroundings:** In addition to collecting waste, the volunteers also swept the pathways around the police station, cleared debris, and removed small stones from public spaces. By doing so, the NSS volunteers ensured that the area was not only clean but also safe for the public and the police staff who frequently use these spaces.
4. **Teamwork and Coordination:** The students were divided into teams, with each team assigned to specific sections of the police station area. The activity was highly organized, and the teams worked efficiently to cover the entire area. Through effective coordination, the students were able to complete the task quickly and thoroughly, while fostering a sense of unity and collaboration among the volunteers.
5. **Awareness and Briefing:** Before starting the cleanliness drive, **Dr. A. V. Jadhav** and **Mr. D. B. Patil** addressed the volunteers, briefing them on the

significance of cleanliness, waste management, and the harmful effects of plastic waste on the environment. The students were encouraged to adopt sustainable practices in their daily lives, such as reducing plastic usage and segregating waste.

6. **Faculty Participation:** **Dr. S. P. Patil** and **Dr. D. J. Bhandare** actively participated in the event, supervising the students and offering guidance where necessary. Their presence and involvement were a source of motivation for the students, reinforcing the importance of community service and environmental stewardship.

Outcomes and Impact:

- **Clean and Safe Police Station Area:** The most significant outcome of the Shramdan activity was the cleanliness and improved aesthetics of the **Police Station Area**. 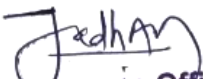
